1. Minutes: of the meeting held on 2nd December were agreed and signed

2. Planning Applications: 19th December – 6th January

1. Ref: 24/01145/FUL land to the rear of Valley View, Station Road, Desford

Details: erection of a bungalow

Decision: Object on the grounds that:

- it is outside the settlement boundary. If permission is granted it will set a precedent for further applications on the north side of Station Road until there is no green wedge between Desford and Newtown Unthank.
- Dangerous access close to a bend onto a busy B classified road, where vehicles are known to exceed the 30mph speed limit both up and down the hill
- The existing access is only a gate into a field with an unmade track.
 The dilapidated state of the barn indicates that there has been no traffic entering or leaving this site for a long time.
- It will not "encourage sustainable modes of transport"; just the opposite. To reach the village centre and its facilities, the occupiers are unlikely to walk this distance uphill. They will use a car. There is mention of allowing residents to cut through the garden of Valley View. This is not marked on the submitted plan. Have the owners of Valley View agreed to this? Even with a "short-cut" the walk will still be unacceptable to reach the shops, doctors, Primary School etc (except to Bosworth Academy).
- The applicant quotes the need for more houses, but Desford has already exceeded our quota up till 2040. The development of 120 dwellings (Davidsons) and 60 dwellings (Jelsons) have both been granted permission in the last 12 months.
